<h3>Alternate Ending</h3> <p>Type a 1 page paper (double spaced) that gives us an alternate ending to the story. How else could the story have ended? Don't forget to use dialogue!</p>	<h3>Dixie Diorama</h3> <p>Make a shoebox diorama of a scene from the book. It can be made out of clay, paper, props, anything! Be creative! Write a short caption to go along with your diorama describing the scene.</p>	<h3>New Book Jacket</h3> <p>Create a new book jacket for the story! Illustrate the new cover (don't forget the title and author) and create the back as well. The back must include a short summary as well as peer reviews.</p>
<h3>Life Size Character</h3> <p>Pick one character from the story to create a life size version of. Think about what that character looks like and wears. On the back, give character traits that describe them and explain why. Pick 3 important things this character has said to include.</p>	<h3>Act out a Scene</h3> <p>Pick your favorite scene from the story to act out for the class. Prepare a script (does not have to follow the book exactly) and make props to show changes in character.</p>	<h3>Compare the <i>Because of Winn-Dixie</i> book and movie.</h3> <p>If you were able to watch the movie, you may notice some similarities and differences. Create a poster showing a venn diagram comparing the two books. Use pictures/sentences or whatever else to make the poster come alive!</p>
<h3>Illustrate</h3> <p>Choose 6 <u>important</u> scenes from the book to illustrate. Write a caption for each illustration. Pictures should be on white paper and fill up almost the whole page.</p>	<h3>Create a Test</h3> <p>Create an end of book test. Questions can come from any point in the book. It should consist of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 10 multiple choice questions 5 True/False questions 2 short answer questions 2 writing prompts <p>Remember to give directions for your test and include an answer key!</p>	<h3>Song/Poem</h3> <p>Write a song or a poem related to the book. It can summarize the story, talk about a character, etc. Record yourself singing the song or reciting the poem to share with the class.</p>

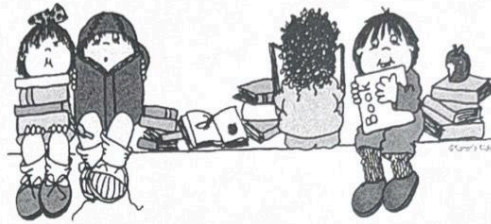
